

'4 Pan Peeps' presented Pan Clash, a well needed uplifting steelpan event for voung people aged 15-25. It was funded by the Kensington and Chelsea Youth Forum with the objective of giving young people the opportunity to progress in any field they enjoy.

Pan Clash took place Pan Clash took plac over three Sundays in October at the Museum of Brands and the Ion Bar - both based in Ladbroke Grove, London. Held during the early afternoon, the events were presented by Kayleigh Lewis, Joel Hamilton-Mills and Alicia Herbert. Each event included a music artist. Alexander D Great whose lyrics were very appropriate for the Black history month season appeared at the first show. LEI of Jam Thugz and Carlene Etienne performed at the following shows with the latter giving an outstanding singing/steelpan performance that left the crowd mesmerized.

Pan Clash involved having a 3 piece steelband accompanied by congas performing two jams (repeated background musical arrangements) with young contestants having four attempts at soloing for up to 60 seconds per jam. The soloist was allowed to use any front line steel pan (tenor, double tenor or double seconds) to participate in the musical battle. It was challenging but certainly motivated the young contestants to experiment with their talent. Three judges were used to score all performances. The first Pan Clash event

saw Jerome Noel and Rodell Sorzano locked in musical battle soloing over

Dan Sadler's composition with Rodell being victorious winning the £100 prize money. Eager to win the second Pan Clash event, Jerome Noel, returned to battle with Charlotte Benso at the Ion Bar and was successful. By the time the final Pan Clash event was hosted the atmosphere was electric. Jerome returned to maintain his title with Rodell and Charlotte also in contention. The musical battle between this talented trio drew numerous 'oohs' and 'ahhs' from the large family audience. Their playing standards certainly evolved and were noted by many. Rodell won the final competition. Judges included steelpan virtuosos

such as Brent Holder, Bubbles, Chris Storey and Samuel Dubois.

Shareen Gray is the founder of Pan Clash; initially the event was to be a forum for the older 'Pan Divas' to take to the stage without a music script to contest their musical skills. However, it was decided that the event would be more vibrant if young people were involved and what a success it was. Pan Clash will be back in March 2008 and will hopefully involve several more steelbands across the UK encouraging their young pan musicians to challenge their soloing skills.
