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
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## Silly Ocean IN TOUR WITH EBONY

Ebony Steelband, the 2007 Notting Hill Panorama Champions supported the international singer. Billy Ocean, on his recent UK tour. For over three decades. Billy has captivated his worldwide audiences with his songs including his global hits 'Caribbean Queen' and 'When the going gets tough'. In 1996, Ebony had the opportunity to support Billy at his concerts.

This time around, with three number 1 hits, Billy Ocean and Ebony started the tour with their first concert at the Hammersmith Apollo in London to an audience in excess of 5000. Ebony's half hour set drew rapturous applause from the patrons initiating the start of a very successful tour. Augustine 'Pepe' Francis, Director of Ebony, stated, "Billy has

Billy in his percussive music mode has played 'Iron' in Ebony's 'engine room' for over twelve years. He also played the tenor pan with them at the 2002 World Steelband Festival in Trinidad.

Ebony's repertoire was arranged by world panorama champion arranger, Annise 'Halfers' Hadeed and included songs like, 'Bahia Girl' and 'Ain't Nobody'. Their

repertoire also included solos from a percussionist. guitarist and a saxophonist. Ebony's manager, Albert Faustine, said "Our performance was exceptional and there were people who did not know about steelband music and we showed them what we are capable of. As a group of young people we showed them our talent and our versatility as we got them involved in certain tunes by singing along and dancing." Billy and Ebony went on to perform at Wolverhampton, Essex and Manchester, In all their concerts female patrons could be seen shouting hysterically, 'we love you Billy' whilst extending their hands for Billy to bring them on stage.

Sean Clarke, a pannist from Ebony said, "It was a great experience. Every performance was slightly different. It gave us the chance to show the versatility of pan playing to a larger audience." Billy confirmed. "I am glad that I was able to do a concert with Ebony again but it would be nice for us to do a collaboration where they play along as I sing. I would love for us to perform together all over the world."
